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Concert at the Stone Pony to benefit The Kortney Rose Foundation

Louie Morreale of Long Branch imagined and planned "Ann Chicken Fest" to get people together through music to support a great cause, The Kortney Rose Foundation. The show was attended by over 200 people at the Stone Pony in Asbury Park on Sunday February 26. The show brought in over \$2,500 and all proceeds were donated to The Kortney Rose Foundation which is a charity named after 9 year old Oceanport resident Kortney Rose Gillette who died of a brain tumor in 2006. The foundation raises awareness and funds for childhood brain cancer research. The band **No More Pain** headlined the event with two other bands, **Mind Riot** and **10 Paces**, opening the show.

No More Pain just released their first CD called "Debate and Rhyme." The band has played at the Stone Pony and the Starland Ballroom, and has opened for major bands such as

Fuel and Monster Magnet, and have had two songs featured on "Honor Thy Drummer" tribute to Mike Portnoy.

The Kortney Rose Foundation is a 501(c)(3) charity that was set up by Kortney's parents, after her death in 2006 from a rare brain tumor, to create her legacy of helping other children through the promise of research. Since inception the foundation has built a playground in Kortney's name, donated hundreds of thousands of dollars to the pediatric brain tumor research program at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and was instrumental in passing legislation naming May as brain tumor awareness month in the State of New Jersey.
