As friends and supporters of The Kortney Rose Foundation looked on, the couple presented the Children's Hospital doctors, who treated their daughter during her battle with a brain tumor, with a check from the Foundation for **\$75,000**. Children's Hospital's pediatric brain tumor research program is one of the premiere programs in the world.
